Integrating multimodal connections in the Adriatic-Ionian region





About ADRIPASS project

ADRIPASS aims at **improving maritime-hinterland freight** connections to boost growth and economic development of the transport sector in the ADRION region.

The project focuses on the identification of soft measures to streamline and enhance the connections on the TEN-T Network recently extended to the Western Balkans, where most Border Crossing Points (BCPs) are located. It also tests specific Information and Communication Technology solutions (Port Community Systems) for streamlining freight transport in ADRION ports, setting standards that could be used within Electronic Data Interchange interfaces.



Objectives

With the development of the ADRIPASS strategy, planning capacities of transport stakeholders and national and European policymakers will, significantly, be improved since all of them are facing the same challenges concerning multimodal transport accessibility and network efficiency on the TEN-T Corridor sections in the ADRION region.

Through ADRIPASS, project partners intend:

- To INCREASE PLANNING COMPETENCES OF ADRION POLICY MAKERS for improved multimodal transport on the TEN-T Corridors in the ADRION region.
- To enhance capacities of ADRION transport stakeholders to STREAMLINE FREIGHT FLOWS at Corridor/BCP level through the use of ICT.
- To ESTABLISH A MULTILEVEL AND
 MULTIDISCIPLINARY COOPERATION NETWORK
 of transport stakeholders and policy makers
 for transport facilitation in the ADRION region.

Activities

DATA COLLECTION to investigate physical and non-physical obstacles at BCPs and on transport flows, from ports to hinterlands.



ICT PILOT ACTIONS and pre-investment studies in ADRION core network ports (Koper, Bar, Ploče, Durrës and Igoumenitsa) as a tool to streamline freight traffic flows and improve the port role of gateways and corridor roots for the transport of goods.



RESULTS TRANSFERRED TO HIGH INSTITUTIONAL

LEVEL to ensure their durability and transferability. The metodologies, tools, analyses and results of previous actions are transferred to the national ministries belonging to the Advisory board, to key policy makers and institutions in the region, such as the European Commission to define a Strategy for the enhancement of multimodal transport and the efficiency and competitiveness of the transport sector in the ADRION region.
